



BLUE CONSPIRACY

When people or an organization informally agree to unintentionally or purposefully do something wrong, harmful, or not legal to small-scale fisheries people in the name of Blue Economy and/or Blue Growth.

ECO-BULLYING

When there is a deliberate attempt to molest, harm, intimidate or force small-scale fisheries people through repeated verbal, physical, or social behavior that is justified as being necessary to protect or conserve the marine or coastal environment.

ECO-HARASSMENT

When outsiders act towards small-scale fishers in a way that causes intense feelings of annoyance, anxiety, worry, or torment among a fishing community. Outsiders justify their actions as being necessary to protect the shoreline environment.

FISHERPHOBIA / MISOHALIA

When attitudes and/or beliefs about small-scale fisheries lead to inexplicable or illogical fear, resulting in discrimination against them or treating them as inferiors.

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PARTiCiPATORY DOMiNATION

In participatory processes, when small-scale fisherpeople are outnumbered or ignored by other, more powerful participants. This can occur openly or secretly and be intentional or without wanting.

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SiDE-LiNiNG FROM GOVERNANCE

A situation that arises when, due to lack of data, capacity, negligence, or discrimination, insufficient or inadequate attention is given to rules governing small-scale fisheries.

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CULTURAL VIOLATIONS

Any action that damages the cultural heritage or assets that small-scale fisheries people value.

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FISHER TRAFFICKING

The practice of employing immigrant small-scale fishers and controlling them through threats of deportation.

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iNDUSTRIAL PiLLAGiNG

When large industries or corporations take away resources or valuables from small-scale fisheries people and their communities.

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MARiNE CARBON iNJUSTiCE

The harm caused to small-scale fisheries, people, and fishing communities due to the inequitable distribution of CO2 emissions, impacts, and risks.

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MARINE PEONAGE (DEBT SLAVERY)

The use of small-scale fisheries people bound in servitude by debt.

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RECREATiONAL ASSAULT

Damage to small-scale fisheries people as a result of recreational fishing (for sport or pleasure rather than necessity).

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SEAFOOD LARCENY / VALUE CHAIN GRABBING

Any action that transfers fish products from a local to a global market and decreases the supply or availability of local fish products in a coastal fisherfolk community.

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
